- Organise and support carrying out focus groups and co-creation workshops in pilot regions inviting citizens, civil society, academics, experts, and policy-makers to coevaluate innovative mechanisms and approaches for citizen engagement in climate change adaptation.
- Continuous communication and dissemination activities.
