- Knowledge exchange and capacity building activities, e.g. training workshops, webpages with resources.





2021 Activity

 In 2021, with the support of the ECSA BioBlitz working group, UK based charity the Natural History Consortium were able to join a collaboration with the University of Andrews to include a cross border BioBlitz activity as part of INTERSECTIONS: an international collaboration for European Researchers Night



2021 EuroBioBlitz


- A race against the clock, working together to put nature on the map across Europe



2021 EuroBioBlitz

NHC produced resources in 7 languages to support BioBlitz practitioners to promote participation among their communities:

- iNaturalist project platform
- Communications pack text for websites and newsletters, photos, logos, <u>film</u>, suggested tweets and social media posts.
- Community pack invitation template, photos, logos, film, suggested tweets and social media posts.
- Schools pack lesson plans for schools and youth groups, invitation template





Learning

- EuroBioBlitz has provided a much needed platform and central capacity for galvanising cross border collaboration
- Digital volunteering and remote formats for community science can thrive in 'post lockdown' society
- iNaturalist is a useful cross border, multilingual platform BUT collaborations would benefit from improved compatibility between other platforms
- Appetite for this kind of activity is high when appropriately resourced









Plans for 2022

- The Natural History Consortium have submitted a bid to European Researchers Night 2022 to repeat EuroBioBlitz and, if successful, are keen to work with the ECSA working group to:
- Build on learning and resources from the 2021 EuroBioBlitz pilot activity
- Collaborate on additional funding bids to grow local participation and support Working Group members
- Translate resources into more languages to broaden participation across more of Europe
