- Create and run training that empowers stakeholders and boosts their involvement in climate governance.
- Work with city representatives from Europe and Ukraine to support pilot projects and local knowledge sharing.



Communication and Outreach:

- Direct online communication to maintain consistent, impactful messages.
- Formulate and implement strategies that promote U-CAN successes and new projects.

Strategic Planning and Assessment:

- Contribute to the development of strategies to foster climate action collaboration.
- Assess and refine communication strategies and tools based on feedback and project requirements.
